The material and resources provided by Choosing Truth Ministries have been made available from a number of authors and ministries. Many of the authors are ex-Masons sharing information along with their love and concern in Jesus for others. There are some however who would use this material out of self-motivation without that love and compassion in Jesus towards others. When used in that context it has the opposite effect of its intended purpose. The following email correspondence demonstrates how Christians with mis-guided intentions lacking the love of Jesus can actually do more harm than good for His Kingdom. I have asked John Smith (not his real name) for permission to make this correspondence available so that Christians can see how hurtful they can be when operating without His love. Please use the ministry material with love as He directs. Prayer is a good place to see where we are and where He wants us. "... but have not love, I am nothing." 1 Cor. 13:1-13.

Received your email, thank you, much appreciated. I can see where you're coming from and can understand the need to defend your position. I've often said that Christianity would be great if it wasn't for the Christians. Unfortunately, while I've often said that out of frustration there is truth to the statement. Tried to figure out why.

I think part of it is because there are hurting people in the church that need love and compassion but as you said there are those with their own agendas and those who fleece the flock rather than be shepherds. Those operating in the flesh rather than walking in the Spirit. The only thing I've been able to do is make a conscious effort of choosing to forgive, even when I don't want to but in obedience to God's Word. Difficult at times but the only way to remove the hook. And of course we don't stay where we're being abused, Jesus did not advocate such.

Tithing, I don't believe it's a N.T. commandment. Giving, yes as the Holy Spirit leads. Tithing was an O.T. command to the Levitical priesthood, who had their hands in the till. It's part of O.T. law, not N.T. grace. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, called for love and compassion not for condemnation and control. I try to listen to Him in ministry effort.

Even though you and I have agreed to disagree I firmly believe and agree that Christian Masons will be in heaven and that you and I have eternity ahead of us through Jesus, His Blood, His sacrifice for the remission of our sins by our confession to make Him Lord and Saviour in our lives. In the area of tithing I expressed a personal belief of giving as led by the Holy Spirit versus the O.T. law of tithing. There are others who have the opposite belief that it's a N.T. commandment. I think Derek Prince has navigated these opposing beliefs with love when he said, "Although I don't believe that tithing is a N.T. commandment, I practice it and I'm blessed by it". I remember those words from one of his teaching tapes. In his book, Blessing or Curse You Can Choose, on page 103, he says, "In the New Testament, God never establishes a specific law, like that of the Old Testament, requiring Christians to set aside for Him a tenth of their total income. The covenant of grace does not operate through laws enforced from without, but though laws written by the Holy Spirit in the hearts of believers. In 2 Corinthians 9:7 Paul instructs Christians, "So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity". On this same page he says, "In Hebrews 8:6 the writer contrasts the Old and the New Covenants, and reminds Christians that they have entered into a "better covenant, which was established on better promises". It is inconceivable that people who enjoy this better covenant should be less generous in giving to God than those who were under an inferior covenant. If God's people under the Law gave Him their tithes – and much more – how could Christian under grace possibly justify doing less? The standards of grace are higher, not lower, than those of law." I also while not believing that tithing is a N.T. commandment have practiced it and have been blessed by doing so. On other occasions I have not practiced it, giving as led by the Holy Spirit and have been blessed by doing so. My firm belief is that obedience is better than sacrifice, that we should obey in whichever way He leads.
